Small Groups

Have we become so preoccupied with the major sins of our society such as stealing, murder or adultery, that we have lost sight of our need to deal with our own, subtler sins? In his book, Respectable Sin, Jerry Bridges addresses a number of specific "acceptable" sins that we tend to tolerate in ourselves—such as jealousy, anger, judgmentalism, selfishness, and pride. He goes on to offer a message of hope in the profound mercy of the gospel and the transforming grace of God as the means to overcome our "respectable sins.". In this small group study we will identify and address the Sins that have become "acceptable" in our lives and draw closer to the word of God as a means to overcome such sins.

KID Central kicked off June 2019. Since then, we have had many wonderful experiences with your children as they have learned about Jesus and the relationship God desires to have with all of us. It has been a joy to watch them grow and see this relationship deepen. Much of our focus in KID Central is on relationships, and I wanted to take a moment to talk about that with you in more detail. We all have many relationships that require our attention. We all give some relationships more time than others. Here at Central, we want you to be able to nurture all of your relationships and we want to help you in that process.

You should be receiving Bible memory verses for your children to practice each month. Also, each week, you should receive arts and crafts that were part of our lesson for that day. Please ask your children what they learned in church to help foster their relationship with God. Pray with them to show that God is part of your lives and He is there for everyone at any time.



On January 25 of this year the United Methodist Women presented their Annual Parade of Tables. 2020 was the eleventh year of this creative and fun fund raiser for the UMW. Over the past years the Parade of Tables each year 20 30 tables boasts to decorated with myriad themes, showcasing the creative

talents of both the women and men of our church. Each year there is often a musical program to entertain the guests, but seeing the are new and different ideas for tables is the real entertainment for not only the members of our church family but guests from throughout the community. A delicious meal is always prepared by the men, and waiters and waitresses under the direction of Elaine Dixon provide excellent service to the tables. The UMW takes the opportunity at the Parade of Tables to present a Special Mission Recognition Pin to someone who has given of their time and talents to the church.
