So yes, as long as God supplies the words, I will place on Paper my thoughts about Praise and Prayer. Maybe it will bring you clarity or peace or hope or laughter but remember it is all from God using this Pilgrim to share the love of Christ with you. I will end with a thought on Praise.

Maybe when you think you should lest Praise God is actually the moment you should Praise him. Paul writes in Philippians 4:4 "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!" We rejoice in Christ not our circumstances.

This month we distributed food and goods to **83 households** with a grand total of **220 people** served.

Statistics of age groups who visited:

0-18= **48**; 19-64 = **117**; 65+ = **55**

Food Lion donated food and other items. The needs are still great, but the donations through Food Lion and Second Harvest have declined due to inventory. The Community Kitchen is in partnership with Second Harvest and we serve on Thursdays from 3:00-4:30pm. Thanks to all those who help to keep this ministry running!

History Minute by Libby Putnam

In 1992, the ladies of our church compiled a cookbook of favorite recipes of the women of our church. A dedication written by members of the Cookbook Committee states, "Because it contains recipes for dishes that we, our mothers and our grandmothers routinely feed our families and bring to covered dish suppers, this book, which contains recipes submitted in 1950, 1970, and 1992, is meant to help us feed not only our bodies, but also our souls. When we use recipes from this book, prayers rise on behalf of those who submitted each recipe that we use. This type of prayer draws us together in a closer fellowship, vital parts of the Lord's business." Many of us in our church have well used cookbooks that look like the one pictured. If you are not one of the lucky ones to have a copy, you may search through the copy in the History Room the next time you need a special recipe. If you are expecting a crowd, perhaps **Elephant Stew** is just the recipe you need:

Elephant Stew

1 elephant 2 rabbits (optional) Seasoned brown gravy


Cut elephant into bite-size pieces. This should take about 2 months. combine with brown gravy to cover in very large kettle. Cook on kerosene stove at 465 degrees for 4 weeks.

Add rabbits only if more people are expected; most people do not like to find hare in their stew.

Yields: 3,800 servings.
