Last month, I asked: What does your heart break for? Is your heart aligned with God so that the Spirit moves in us to break our hearts open so that we can be the hands and feet of Christ?

I still ask those questions daily to myself. Let me add one more question to the list: "How is God asking me to care for the most vulnerable in my community?" (Sandi Somers). I recently read this question in the *Upper Room and have added it to my list*.

In Luke 3:11, John the Baptist answered the crowd of people who had come to be baptized by saying, "The one who has two shirts must share with someone who has none, and the one who has food must do the same." Community in Christ can make a difference in other's lives. We can help the vulnerable by working together, and our impact circle widens as we partner with other organizations. Some organizations can be local in Kings Mountain, and others can include 106.9, Compassion International, Samaritans's Purse, Mercy House Global, and Manos da Fe of Panama. And these are just a few groups we can partner with to make a difference.

When you Surrender your life to Christ, it is not your own. Therefore, your obedience to Christ leads you to follow his voice; where his heart breaks, yours will also. Being broken open can be tricky, yet beauty and abundance can emerge. When a seed deep in the earth splits open, it becomes abundantly more, and many benefits can be reaped. What a privilege, honor, and joy to see what God is doing in other's lives when we follow His voice.

A History Minute

In 1888, the women of our church organized the Woman's Missionary Society with Mrs. James W. Tracy, a charter member of our church, as president. There were six charter members of the group who stated that their organization was the result of their sensing the need for a greater emphasis on mission work.

By the year 1912, the number of members had grown to around forty, and in 1923, the society was divided into circles. In September of 1940, the Woman's Missionary Society became the Woman's Society of Christian Service, and in 1972 became known as the United Methodist Women. Early this year, women of our church met to organize our current women's group, Central Methodist Women of KM (CMWKM). Meetings for CMWKM are open to all the women of the church and will be held at 6:30PM on the first Monday of each month, excluding summer months. Members will meet as one large group with smaller groups responsible for bereavement meals when needed. All women of the church are invited to attend the next CMWKM meeting on Monday, October 2 at 6:30 PM in the CAC.

Plans for the 2024 Parade of Tables, a project of the women to help fund several missions opportunities, will be discussed. Through all of the years and name changes, the mission has remained constant and that is to experience and share Christ's love throughout our church, the community, and the global ministry of the church.
